Key Accomplishments:

- Co-designed a Life Skills Training Pathway for foster parents, including essential resources and a menu of at-home activities. Evaluated and approved curriculum, advancing to become a certified trainer and authoring original training materials
- Advocated for the creation of the Youth Navigator Network initiative, and served on its Implementation Team and Youth Council
- Represented the OHIO YAB on the Partners for Ohio's Families (PFOF) council
- Reached out to Ohio legislators, including the Governor, to champion the creation of the Youth Ombudsman Office. Following its historic establishment, designed an interview rubric, scoring mechanism and core case flow process.
